School update...

We are now into our fourth week at St. Casimir's School and are the third and fourth grade Math classes are already immersed into learning about place value to the 1,000 place in third grade and to the 10,000 place in the fourth grade. The online Math curriculum has been a great way to refresh the students' memories of all things place value related through the use of flashcards that are kept in an interactive notebook for the kids to use as a reference.

In the Language Arts classes, the students are reviewing how and when to use punctuation, capitalization, nouns and relative pronouns through the practice of writing an opinion piece. The kids were given the writing prompt of "What is the best way to eat an egg? Why?" and were asked to think about what kind of egg they most like to eat and what about its preparation makes it the best. After a few examples of my own, the kids were able to come up with some great opinion writings!

The students are learning about the body and its systems in Science class. They have already covered the digestive, nervous and respiratory systems. We have had some very interesting (and might I add - colorful!) conversations revolving around these three systems!

Creating 3D pictures of hearts was the goal of a recent Art project after viewing a tutorial in making 3D pictures. Discussions were held on "What if the heart wasn't perfect?" We then talked about how none of us are perfect and that is what makes art - art. Showcasing our individual abilities that are gifts from God in the use of line and complimentary colors are what makes art unique. The hearts turned out beautifully and are displayed in the stairwell leading to our classroom.

Religion class has given the students the opportunity to practice looking up verses in the Bible. Several of the kids said at the end of the lessons that they wanted to go home and continue looking up verses in the family Bible. A lesson well-learned!
