St Casimir School Update

The SCS third and fourth graders are completing their study of the northeast region in Social Studies and adding to a map that portrays items affiliated with the northeast. Some examples are lobsters in Maine, Niagara Falls and the Statue of Liberty in New York, syrup in Vermont, and cranberries in Massachusetts, etc. When asked to write about where they would like to visit in their Language Arts class, the majority chose Hershey, Pennsylvania, where the whole town smells like chocolate!

The fifth and sixth graders have been learning about the Native American regions in our country and the various tribes from each area along with their ways of living. The students are in the process of writing facts about each region and setting up a museum that has objects that pertain to each particular nation. Some examples of these are totem poles which are from the northwest tribes and longhouses from the eastern woodlands. They are also learning about the history that includes The Trail of Tears, Custer's Last Stand and famous Native Americans such as Jim Thorpe, Squanto and Sitting Bull. A more in depth study includes researching the present day life of Native Americans, including life on reservations.

February is also Black History Month, so we are reading about famous African Americans such as Frederick Douglas, Sojourner Truth, Martin Luther King and many more. Learning about the civil rights movement that came about in the 1960's has brought out some great discussions. This group of students always has much to say and ask on every topic. The goal of Social Studies is to teach students to be informed about local and world events, and these children are and will be future informed citizens--a benefit for all of us!
