School Update...

"Adding fun to learning creates the best educational experience possible" -Tamara L. Chilver

As a teacher. I have always tried to make things fun for my students. In my fifth and sixth grade classroom, I implement different kinds of activities to best capture my students' attention. The past few months have been filled with learning, exploring and putting this teaching technique into practice. In Language Arts class, the students have focused on differentiating types of nonfiction texts including the types, structures and features. Interactive notebook activities, online review games and read-aloud books have all been utilized in this process.

During Math class, a Clevertouch screen has been implemented for lessons, and the students are learning a new interactive game online to reinforce the lessons. And finally, for Science, the students learned how to separate salt from water to calculate an approximation of how much salt is in the ocean. They also used their engineering skills to build a marble run, and made rain in a cup by creating a simple model of the ocean and sky. The students even examined the causes of flooding using the realworld example of Hurricane Katrina. In the activity, students proposed plans to prevent flooding and save historic buildings in a coastal town -all while staying within budget. Quite a feat!

With the goal of creating the best educational experience possible always in mind, it has been a joy to see the excitement on my students' faces as they truly enjoy the process of learning! Submitted by Ethel Aranda
