STJB Cemetery Decorating Rules

The STJB Cemetery Board reserves the right to regulate the way the cemetery looks, therefore, has developed the following grave decorating guidelines. Please abide by these guidelines to show respect of others' final resting place.

Please keep the decorations fresh and clean. Decorations should be a simple reflection of nature. The Cemetery Board reserves the right to remove any decoration that it deems to be inappropriate.

Plants and fresh flowers are allowed at gravesites until first frost then must be removed. Plants must be in an urn and in an urn stand. Fresh flowers must be in vases that are permanently attached to the grave marker. Glass jars and other breakable containers are not suitable as they can be easily broken and cause injury.

***Special decorating of gravesites are permitted until **two weeks after Memorial Day**. After this time, if decorations are not removed, the Maintenance Crew/Cemetery Board will disposed of decorations. No notice will be given and the Cemetery Board will not be responsible for your reimbursement. – Example of special decorating includes, religious markers, ornamental objects, shepherd hooks, flags, solar powered lights, eternal lights and artificial flowers or plants. Decorations must not infringe on others gravesites and must not blow away.

No planting or digging-in of plants, shrubs, evergreens or trees.

Many people visit the cemetery each year. Because the cemetery is open to the public, it is very difficult to control the activity of every visitor. We regret that we cannot guarantee decorations will be free from damage or disappearance and we caution you against leaving anything of great value on any grave in the cemetery.

We wish to thank you for your understanding and cooperation in adhering to these Rules and Regulations.

STJB Cemetery would like to thank all who so generously donated to the cemetery fund. Funds will be used for ground maintenance and upkeep. If you wish to donate to the cemetery fund, you can find an envelope in your contribution envelope or simply mark an envelope "Cemetery Fund" and place it in the offertory basket.

OLMC Cemetery Guidelines

OLMC Cemetery follows the same guidelines as most other (Catholic) cemeteries.

PLEASE NOTE – I have in the past not strictly enforced the standard guidelines of placement and removal of flowers and memorials. I do welcome these items, as it brightens and brings color to the cemetery. I ask that all items be secured, as to not tip over or blow freely around. I will eventually pick up any items that do not stay secure or become damaged by time and weather elements. I do take the beauty of our cemetery very seriously and do my best to maintain its beauty. St. Casimir Catholic Cemetery Decorating Rules

A Catholic cemetery is a sacred place. This Catholic Cemetery must be maintained in honor and dignity. Decorating a grave is a privilege not a right. To protect the sacredness of its grounds, as well as the obligation of safety, and to reduce the burden of maintenance, we respectfully request your cooperation in following these Rules and Regulations, which apply for the mutual protection and benefit of all grave owners.

The Cemetery Committee reserves the right to remove and discard any decorations which violate these Rules and Regulations as well as those decorations or objects it deems unsightly, offensive, or not in keeping with the spirit of these Rules and Regulations:

- Cemetery decorations should be a simple reflection of nature.
- Fresh flowers and plants must be in urn stands or in invertible vases that are permanently attached to the grave marker.
- Breakable containers are not suitable as they can be easily broken and cause injury.
- Absolutely no planting or digging-in of plants.
- No steel hearts, shepherd hooks, stands, bird feeders, pinwheels, or other ornamental objects are allowed.
- No electronic or solar powered decorations.
- ***Special decorating of gravesites is permitted for: Easter -Palm Sunday until Divine Mercy Sunday Memorial Day -May 15 until June 15 Independence Day -June 27 until July 11 All Souls Day-October 26 until November 9 Christmas-1st Sunday of Advent until February 1st

The Maintenance crew will dispose of any decorations that are not removed by the deadline.

Most Rev. Robert E. Barron appointed bishop for the Diocese of Winona-Rochester

Winona, Minnesota, June 2, 2022 – Today, the Holy See announced that Pope Francis has appointed the Most Rev. Robert E. Barron, Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, as the ninth bishop of the Diocese of Winona-Rochester. His installation Mass has been set for Friday, July 29.

Bishop Barron, born on November 19, 1959 in Chicago, spent his childhood in Detroit and then in a suburb of Chicago. Bishop Barron studied at Mundelein Seminary in Chicago and at the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC before being ordained a priest on May 24, 1986.

After serving as an associate pastor for three years, Bishop Barron was sent to study at the Institut Catholique de Paris where he completed his Doctorate of Sacred Theology. Bishop Barron served as professor of theology at Mundelein Seminary from 1992 to 2015 and also served as its president-rector from 2012 to 2015.

Bishop Barron launched his Word on Fire Catholic Ministries in 2000 and has been broadcast extensively throughout the world. His 10-part documentary, *Catholicism*, aired on public television in the United States and he is the first priest since Venerable Archbishop Fulton Sheen to have a regular national program on a commercial television network.

Bishop Barron, through his clear teaching and love of the Gospel, has been able to share the truth of the Gospel to millions through the internet and, in particular, social media. Barron's Word on Fire website hosts daily blog posts, weekly articles and video commentaries and Bishop Barron has over 3.1million Facebook followers, 517,000 YouTube subscribers, 349,000 Instagram followers, and 198,000 Twitter followers. On receiving the news of his appointment, Bishop Barron said: "I am overjoyed and humbled to receive this new assignment as the ninth bishop of Winona-Rochester. I look forward immensely to getting to know the good people, priests, and pastoral ministers of the diocese. I will have to brush off my Chicago winter coat, which has remained unused for the past six years in Santa Barbara! My fondest hope is that I might be a good spiritual father to all the Catholics of southern Minnesota."

"I am filled with joy that Pope Francis has appointed Bishop Robert Barron as the 9th Bishop of the Diocese of Winona-Rochester," said Most Rev. John M. Quinn. "His commitment to evangelization and missionary discipleship will bear great fruit in the coming years."

A press conference was held on June 2, at 11:00a.m.via live stream on the Diocesan website (**www.dowr.org**)

The Diocese of Winona-Rochester serves the 20 southernmost counties of Minnesota with more than 130,000 Catholics and 107 parishes, four high schools, 30 elementary schools and the Immaculate Heart of Mary Seminary on the campus of St. Mary's University in Winona.
