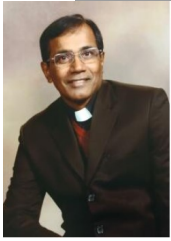

PRAYER & WORSHIP



32nd Ordinary Sunday Bulletin Message, November 10, 2024-B Cycle

Readings: 1 Kings 17:10-16; Hebrews 9:24-28; Mark 12:38-44

Biblical Walk through the parts of the Mass-Part 7

4. The Gloria and Collect:

The tone of the liturgy now shifts from sorrowful repentance to joyful praise as we arrive at a prayer known as the Gloria. The opening line of the Gloria is taken from the words sung by the angels over the fields of Bethlehem, announcing to the shepherds the good news of Christ's birth: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among people with whom He is pleased" (LK 2:14).

The Christian who prays the 'Gloria' joins the great men and women throughout salvation history in their praise of God for His work of salvation and for His own glory.

"Gloria" sums up the story of Christ's saving work moving from 1) His coming, to 2) His redeeming death, to 3) His triumphant resurrection and ascension into heaven. Jesus is addressed as "Son of the Father" and the "Only Begotten Son". The God of the universe actually took on a human nature. The "Gloria's" reference to Jesus as "Lamb of God" moves the story forward to Christ's redemptive mission. It recalls the theme of the Lamb's triumph over sin and the devil in the book of **Revelation: 5:6-14; 12:11; 17:14** and the worship of the Lamb by the angels and saints in heaven: **Rev. 5:8, 12-13; 7:9-10; 14:1-3**. The "Gloria" reverently leads us to praise Jesus in the unique position of authority He now possesses in heaven: "You are seated at the right hand of the Father".

The whole mission of Jesus is summed up in the prayer "Gloria". We move from the Son's Incarnation, to His Paschal Mystery, to His enthronement in Heaven. We move from praising Jesus as the "Only Begotten Son" of the Father who became flesh and dwelt among us; to worshiping Him as the "Lamb of God" who by His sacrifice takes away the sin of the world.

In the Gloria, we joyfully express our gratitude for having received salvation from Christ. **We come to Mass conscious of two things:** 1) **we stand greatly in need of redemption**, recognizing our own insignificance. We see our weakness and utter poverty. 2) **We have actually been saved** perceiving our strength. We see our power and greatness.

After the Gloria, the priest invites the people to pray a prayer known as the Collect. This prayer gathers together the intentions of the people participating in the Mass and concludes the introductory Rites.

ST. CASIMIR'S SCHOOL

Hello from the Second and Third Grade Classroom at St. Casimir's Catholic School!

My class is very impressive with each of them growing well in many aspects. They really enjoy doing hands-on activities like making 3D projects of a forest and water ecosystem for Science class. After reading the lesson, they're so excited to create a 3D ecosystem. Before they start their project, I gave some instructions for their safety of handling the materials and equipment that they're using during the making of their 3D project. Since this is a group project, they shared ideas on how they will come up with amazing outputs.



In our Arts session, we created a very colorful paper flower. It is so refreshing to see the crafts that they made. I am so happy watching their mental and art skills progress each week. In our Math session, I witnessed each of them develop their skills on a daily basis. My second graders were able to apply addition and subtraction concepts, complete the number patterns, add two-digit numbers and solve word problems using these operations. In my third-grade class, they learned about place value, addition and subtraction in two- and three-digit numbers, and solved word problems using these operations. In Social Studies, they were able to locate places using grid maps and different land-forms. During our Language Arts sessions, the students were able to learn what a sentence is and the proper way of writing one, as well as the difference between telling, commanding, asking and exclaiming sentences. They also learned the spelling of different words with short a, o, u, i, e, diphthongs ou, oi words, vowel digraphs ew, oo words and vowel-consonant-e words.

I am so grateful to have wonderful students who are fast learners and who complete their activities so well. Every one of my students has strengths and weaknesses, and it is important to understand their learning preferences. During the process of sharing a lesson, I make sure to provide encouraging movement like brain breaks which help make the lessons more enjoyable and engaging. I believe play improves the cognitive, physical, social, and emotional well-being of children and young people. Through play, children learn about the world and themselves. They also learn skills they need for study, work and relationships such as confidence. These students work together well as a team to finish their project on time. I really love my class!
