



#### From Fr. Havel...

St. Paul writes to the Thessalonians in our Second Reading: "For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night. When people are saying, "Peace and security", then sudden disaster comes upon them,...But you, brothers and sisters, are not in darkness, for that day to overtake you like a thief. For all of you are children of the light and children of the day. We are not of the night or of darkness. Therefore, let us not sleep as the rest do, but let us stay alert and sober."

As we come closer to the end of another church year we hear once again of God's call to always be ready. We cannot become so comfortable in our lives that we trust more in worldly ways than the love of God. I do not know if there is an actual day when Covid-19 became such a major part of people's lives but I think it was sometime in March.
