#### From Fr. Havel...

This weekend we hear in our Scripture readings about the Holy Spirit. In our first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we not only hear of the many healings done by God through the apostles but when the Samaritans accepted the word of God, we are told Peter and John, "went down and prayed for them, that they might receive the Holy Spirit."

Our second reading from the first Letter of Saint Peter encourages us to be faithful to the Lord. "For Christ also suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, he was brought to life in the Spirit."

In our Gospel reading, Jesus prepares the disciples for his Ascension (celebrated on May 24) and then the coming of the Holy Spirit on the first Pentecost. It is the promise of Jesus that God's love will always be with us. We will never be orphaned by the Lord.

It is the gift of the Holy Spirit, the power of God's love, that continues to guide us in our lives. It is this wonderful gift that raises us to new life in the Lord. Come Holy Spirit, Come.

In the Sacred Scriptures, at the time of the Ascension of the Lord, Jesus told the disciples to go back to Jerusalem and pray for the gift of the Holy Spirit. It almost seems like a 'stay at home' order that we have become so familiar within our own lives. The disciples did as Jesus commanded and when the Holy Spirit came upon them all things became new in God's powerful love. Even as we start to gather again as people of God, things will be new. Come, Holy Spirit! Some things we will need to do, and each parish needs to plan for, will be coming out soon. A few of those needs will be:

- The dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass remains in effect until further notice.
- Those over 65 and with underlying heath conditions are strongly encouraged not to attend. Anyone with a household member, or they themselves are showing signs of sickness, should not attend.
- Signs will be posted concerning social distancing and sanitation requirements.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at all entryways.
- Please follow all local safety orders specifically related to proper face coverings such as masks.
- People will be instructed not to greet each other by touching.
- The space will be thoroughly sanitized before and after each service, including entryways and doors. Holy water fonts will be empty and hymnals will be removed.
- Ventilation will be increased as much as possible, by opening windows and doors, as weather permits.
