



Dear Parishioners,

This weekend is Palm Sunday, April 4 & 5. I have blessed the palms early this year and they're available to pick up at each of the churches. Easton will have them available in the garage, MN Lake's are on a table at the side entrance, and Wells will be in the elevator entrance. There will be a place to put your old palms you may still have in your home, so please feel free to bring them in to discard when you come for your fresh ones. The palms will be in the shipping bags and I would ask you to please keep the bags closed as much as you are able. The air dries them out and makes them brittle. If you wish to braid the palms fresher is better. Take as many as you will use in your homes.

Palm branches remind us of the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem. The people sang his praises and laid the branches on the ground as a carpet for the Lord. We are invited to place the branches in our homes so that they may remind us of the saving work Jesus did for each of us. Next year, we will be again invited to bring these branches back to the church. They will be burned, sifted, and the ashes used on Ash Wednesday as we once again renew our commitment to repentance and turning our lives to the Lord.

Since the beginning of the states "Stay at Home" policy I have been saying a private Mass each day. Please know that you are in my prayers. What I have come to realize is how much of the Mass is congregational (truly a prayer of the people.) Without the music, and without the presence and participation of the people of God, the Mass seems to be so much different. I know that it is still the Sacrament but it reminds me as I pray how much we are God's people, loved as individuals but brought together to live, love, and pray as God's people. May the love of God inspire us and take away unnecessary anxiety in these difficult times.
