PRAYER & WORSHIP



Today we celebrate Trinity Sunday. In this feast we celebrate our belief that we were created by LOVE, in LOVE, and for LOVE. This belief affects the way we view the world, our relationships and the way we act. Jesus tells us in the Gospel that we live in the world, but we must not be of the world. What Jesus is telling us is that because of sin those that live in the world, do not share this point of view, but act out of self-interest and always are twisting things in the world to their own advantage. Life in Christ is lived out in sacrificial love for others, and not self-seeking. It is no longer I who live but Christ who lives with in me. We strive to constantly please God by willing the good of the other as other. This affects everything we do and how we

order our lives. This world view is difficult to live out because it goes against our own sinful nature and often sets us against the grain of how most people are living in the world around us. As Paul teaches us, we must become like shining stars amid a depraved generation. If we embrace a God of Love and live out our lives in sacrificial love, we will face opposition in this world, but God promises us that ultimately His plan of Love wins out and that those that are in Him will last forever, and that those who are not will perish.



Reading the First Testament, it becomes evident that no one can actually "see" God in any of its passages. There are accounts of God's voice, instructions, and commandments, but there are no instances of anybody seeing God face-to-face. Today's first reading, for instance, recounts the meeting of the Lord with Moses at Mount Sinai where God reveals his name, "The lord, a merciful and gracious God...." (Exodus 34:6). In the New Testament, God makes himself known through Jesus, his only son, who reveals the fullness of the Father and through whom we receive the fullness of eternal life by the Holy Spirit. In this great solemnity of the Holy Trinity, we celebrate God's merciful love for all of us. Today, God draws us to him, asking us to love our brothers and sisters and to overcome our differences and disagreements. The Blessed Trinity is a communion of love that can inspire us to build communion at home, in our communities, and in the world. This week, ask about the situations in which

you have witnessed the Trinitarian communion at work. Where have you seen Trinitarian love in your lives? These and other related questions can serve to inspire a sincere dialogue between ministers and the community.

When Nick arrived at our Rochester Overnight Shelter, he was homeless, struggling with addiction, and had ridden his bike all the way from the Twin Cities. We helped him to get connected with AA supports, find temporary work, and obtain work clothes. Our shelter staff also packed him a lunch and some snacks each night to get him through the following workday. Eventually, this led to full-time employment and an apartment of his own. After months of hearing nothing from Nick, he returned recently with a few cases of water to check in on our shelter guests. He was so thankful that Catholic Charities was there for him when he was ready to give up hope!

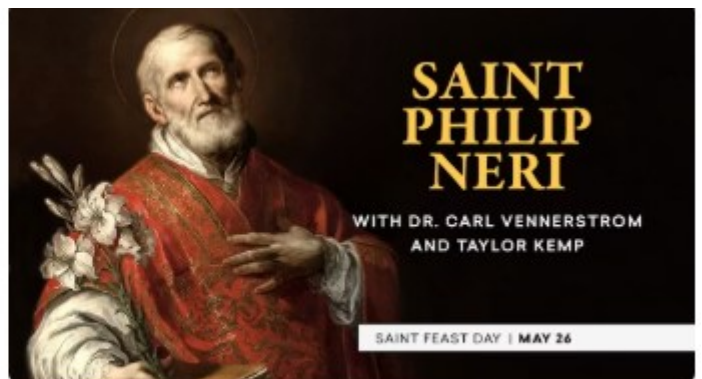
DIOCESE UPCOMING EVENTS

Diocese of Winona-Rochester - Child Sexual Abuse Policy Information

The Diocese of Winona-Rochester will provide a prompt, appropriate and compassionate response to reporters of sexual abuse of a child by any diocesan agent (employees, volunteers, vendors, religious or clergy). Anyone wishing to make a report of an allegation of sexual abuse should call the Victim Assistance Coordinator at 507-454-2270, Extension 255. A caller will be asked to provide his or her name and telephone number. Individuals are also encouraged to take their reports directly to civil authorities. The Diocese of Winona-Rochester is committed to protecting children, young people and other vulnerable people in our schools, parishes and ministries. The diocesan policy is available on the diocesan web site at www.dowr.org under the Safe Environment Program. If you have any questions about the Diocese of Winona's implementation of the Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, please contact Michael Gerard, at 507-361-3377, or mgerard@dowr.org. Anyone working or volunteering in a Catholic parish or school is a mandated reporter. Anyone who knows or has reason to believe that a minor (a person under the age of 18) or vulnerable adult is or has been abused or neglected, must report all suspected abuse or neglect to proper civil authorities/law enforcement within 24 hours of the abuse or neglect becoming known to him or her and must also follow up with a written report to civil authorities within 72 hours, exclusive of weekends and holidays. Many people working or volunteering in a Catholic parish or school, including clergy, are mandated reporters under state law.
